





Stained Glass Windows of Healing - Anointing of the Sick by Jodi Tooke

The stained glass windows in the church building depict the seven sacraments, “outward signs instituted by Christ to give grace.” The two windows closest to the Sacred Heart of Jesus statue show the sacraments of healing—Anointing of the Sick and Penance.

First we’ll explore Anointing of the Sick.

Jesus said to him, “Rise, take up your mat, and walk.” Immediately the man became well, took up his mat, and walked. John 5:8-9

In this window we see a young man in a pale robe seated on a wooden pallet. Jesus in brilliant red takes his hand, inviting him to stand. The golden rays behind Jesus emanating from the hand of God represent the Holy Spirit in Jesus’s touch. The man in ordinary brown behind Jesus experiences the miracle, and we can see his conversion of heart in his witness and imitation of Jesus’s action. The dove with the olive branch below symbolizes the peace and hope found in healing.

Jesus came to heal the whole person, body and soul.

Through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. When given, the desired effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed. But even if not physically healed, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with whatever may accompany serious illness or old age.

Remember, each sacrament has two unique characteristics: a specific material or gesture (matter) used in the sacramental rite and the words used or significance expressed (form). For the Anointing of the Sick, matter is anointing with the Oil of the Sick. The form is “Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin, save you, and raise you up.”

Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.—James 5:14-15





Biografía y vocación del Papa León XIV

Robert Francis Prevost (Estados Unidos, 1955), nació en Chicago. El 30 de enero de 2023, el Papa Francisco lo nombró prefecto del Dicasterio para los Obispos y presidente de la Pontificia Comisión para América Latina. Fue creado y proclamado Cardenal por el Papa Francisco el 30 de septiembre de 2023. El 8 de mayo de 2025 -bajo el nombre de León XIV- ha sido elegido el Romano Pontífice número 267.

Biografía

El Papa León XIV, Cardenal Robert Francis Prevost, O.S.A., Prefecto del Dicasterio para los Obispos (2023-2025) y Arzobispo-Obispo emérito de [Chiclayo](#), nació el 14 de septiembre de 1955 en Chicago (Illinois, Estados Unidos).

El menor de tres hermanos, creció en Estados Unidos junto a sus padres, quienes estaban muy involucrados en las actividades de la parroquia. Sus cuatro abuelos eran inmigrantes, provenientes de Francia y España.

Robert Francis Prevost relata su vocación

En una reciente [entrevista a la RAI](#), recuerda: «Conocí la Iglesia a través de la experiencia parroquial a nivel local. También estudié en una escuela parroquial. En este sentido, tal vez gracias también a la cercanía de algunos sacerdotes diocesanos, nació la idea de la posibilidad de convertirme en sacerdote.

Posteriormente conocí a mi familia religiosa, los agustinos. Tras un breve tiempo de discernimiento para tomar una decisión, y también al conocer a otros jóvenes que habían ido con los agustinos», a los 14 años, ingresó en el Seminario Menor de los Padres Agustinos.

«Antes del noviciado, es la historia de un joven que vive con otros jóvenes, conociéndose a sí mismo y, como hijo de san Agustín, conociendo a los demás, la importancia de la amistad y de una vida comunitaria. Fue en esos años que nació una cierta inquietud y un deseo de ser misionero: no de quedarme en mi país, sino de participar en algún tipo de actividad como sacerdote o religioso».

León XIV habla sobre la importancia de la amistad con su padre para su vocación
